IES.Sanxillao has secondary education and vocational training in the field of catering industry students. Our catering industry, successful around the world is directly related to tourism, which is one of the main industries in Spain. Therefore, we need to give our students the best education and training in their field of study skills. Our aim is that our students and staff improve their language skills and have the opportunity to see how people from other countries work in this area.

Our international experience started in 2009 when one of our teachers participated in the Leonardo GATEVT- 2009. In 2010, our school started a bilingual programme with our catering students. This programme consists of teaching vocational training subjets such as marketing our nutrition in English. This programme and the English for catering subject established in the curriculum of the students help one another to widen the students knowledge in their field of study so that they can go abroad and carry out their training in enterprises within the EU. Some of our students are currently doing their traineeship in European enterprises in Lyon and London, thanks to mobility programmmes and we would like to continue with this experience.

We would also like to encourage our staff and students to visit institutions abread, so that they can benefit from the interchange of ideas with colleges from other countries.

Our objective is to improve the quality of our vocational training studies as well as social and labour competence of aur students and staff. Therefore, we are interested in workplacements in foreing enterprises specialised in catering industry and interchange programmes or visits to vocational training schools, and universities in arder to improve the quality of our training, enterpreneurs skills and chances of employment of our students.

We are interested in all the countries in Europe and if posible, we would like to find partners outside Europe.

To find our patners we will use all the ITC in our hands, and so we will also brush up the skills of our students and staff. We will use the webpage of our institution, we will write e mails and we will use video conferencying (skype) to contact foreign enterprises which might be interested in joining our mobility programmes. Once we have found enterprises and institutions which share the ideas in our projects we would do preparatory mobility visits to work together on the project and make specifict agreements for the monitoring of the programme, number of students, activities and tasks, travel arrangements, possible accommodation etc.

They will search for host institutions and enterprises through webpages,e-mails and videoconferencying (skype). Some of the staff of these dpts will participate in preparatory visits. They will coordinate all the students'and staff paperwork. Application forms, insurances, travel arrangements and accommodation.

They will monitor the students traineeship, interchange programmes and visits when abroad.

When having incoming students, there will be preparatory meetings. Our staffwill welcome incoming students and staff helping them to accommodate .The incoming staff and students will join the daily life of our institution with the help of our students and staff from the different areas they are interested in.

The coordinator informs the Board of Directors about the whole process.
